II. <u>HIGHLIGHT ACTIVITIES:</u>

- Nityaasha Foundation registered for <Give India Fund Raising Campaign>"Give India -Nityaasha Foundation fundraisers and shared link https://fundraisers.giveindia.org/nonprofits/nityaasha-foundation
- Half yearly pathology test & Annual Pathology test (Red Category HbA1c above 10%):
 - 1). 76 children completed half yearly HbA1c test in the month of June & July. 39 children were allowed to do test by self in their local pathology laboratory as it was difficult to come to Pune. The pathology test bills were submitted and reimbursement done. 37 children test were done at A. G. Diagnostic Pvt. Ltd.
 - 2). 3 children half yearly Hba1c test was done in the month of August & September 2020.
 - 3). Out of 74 children, 31 children are in Red category (HbA1c above 10%).
 - 4). 29 children of the Red category zone were retested for their HbA1c in October 2020. 19 children are still under Red category.
 - 5). Annual pathology test: 79 children completed their annual pathology test scheduled in the month of December 2020& January 2021. 30 children are in Red Category.

- In the month of June 2021, Wohner GmbH & Co. KG, A German Company has sent 100 Face Shields to Nityaasha Foundation which we have donated to Sassoon General Hospital.
- 21st Nityaasha Managing Committee Meeting was held on 13.06.2020 at Messung System Pvt. Ltd. Conference Hall, Pune.
- Special project on Covid 19 aid funded by LFAC: Received an amount of Rs.444,653/- from LFAC for Covid19 Grocery fund. The major activities in the month of July 2020 were disbursements of food grain, essential items, milk and vegetables to the families of Nityaasha registered children.

- E-survey for T1DM children during lockdown period hasbeen conducted by Nityaasha and data filled up in Google drive.
- "Process of Medical Aid Dispensing for Long distance T1DM children" was planned as it was difficult for the children to come to Pune to collect medical aid.
- Nityaasha children SSC/ HSC Result 2020: 7 children appeared the SSC / HSC Board examination and all of them cleared the exam.
- 2nd Phase Ration Disbursement: Number of families covered in the 2nd phase of ration disbursement is 36 families (37 T1DM children as 0ne family has T1DM sibling).
- 18 families visited Nityaasha centre & collected food grains items and also gave them Rs.900/- per child for milk for a month.
- 12 children milk amount was transferred directly to the account given by parents.
- 6 children milk amount was paid to the shop along with ration amount.

- On occasion of World Diabetes Day, Members of Inner Wheel Club visited Nityaasha Centre and also interacted with T1DM Children. Received donation amount of Rs.51840/towards sponsorship of 6 children for insulin for 6 months. Sponsorship of 1 T1DM child for one year was donated Mrs. Mandakini Tata. They also handed over goodie bags which were distributed to the children.
- The 22nd Nityaasha Managing Committee Meeting was held at Merchant Bungalow, Kalyani Nagar, Pune on 19th December 2020.
- Mrs. Purnima Pati, an MSW joined Nityaasha Foundation as a Medical Social Worker w.e.f.3rd December 2020.
- Received 80 packets of Sugar free Chocolates from M/S Food Nest, who is a Dietician associated with Indian Diabetic Association, Pune Chapter for Nityaasha Children. Also received a donation of Rs.5000/- from Mr. Sachin Dhankude for goodie packets to be distributed to Nityaasha children.
- LFAC has approved funds of Rs.312,886/- for medical aid (Insulin + 2 strips per day per child) for 25 phased out children for 6 months due to Covid19 crisis (LFAC Project 2).

Annual Pathology Test:

- 86 children completed their Annual Pathology test in Dec.'20 & January 2021.
- A program on Menstrual Hygiene in collaboration with Inner wheel Club of Pune Downtown was organized at Nityaasha centre on 18th February 2021. The club donated 40 hygiene kits to the adolescent girls of Nityaasha Foundation. 10 Adolescent T1DM girls along with their mothers attended the lecture. The kits were distributed to the participants.
- Due to the 2nd Wave ofCovid Crisis, Nityaasha team were instructed to work from

home w.e.f. 11th March 2021 onwards. Medical aid was dispensed from KEM Hospital & Medplus, Kalyani Nagar. For long distance children, a stock of 3 months of medical aid was disensed.
